## **Event concept:**

The Asia-Pacific region is one of the most underrepresented regions at the International Criminal Court ("ICC" or "Court"), with only 34% of countries in the region being party to the Rome Statute. This event, organized jointly by the Court and The Hague Project Peace and Justice, seeks to explore the engagement of the region with the Rome Statute system and encourage students and young professionals from the region to consider a career in international criminal justice and at the ICC. The Asia Pacific Forum started in 2018, aiming to facilitate an open dialogue about the Asia Pacific region's engagement with and contribution to international criminal justice. Following the second Forum in 2019, the ICC and the Hague Project Peace and Justice are delighted to host the third Asia Pacific Forum in a virtual format.

The event comprises two panel discussions, each followed by a Q&A session. Panel 1 will consist of two ICC judges from the Asia-Pacific region. The judges will introduce the work and mandate of the ICC from respective viewpoints to enhance the discussions on challenges and opportunities for the international criminal justice. Panel 2 will consist of ICC staff members and an intern from the Asia-Pacific region who will reflect on their experiences working in the international system and their motivation for working at the Court.
